## CRÈME DE LA CRÈME DISCIPLINE POLICY

- 1. Discipline is the on-going process of helping children to develop their controls so that they can manage their own behavior in socially approved/acceptable ways.
- 2. Discipline techniques should always be based on respect for the child.
- 3. Discipline techniques should be appropriate for the child's developmental level and should not be out of proportion to any particular inappropriate behavior.
- 4. Expectation for children's behavior should be realistic for the child's developmental level and include the basic premise that "children should learn from making mistakes".
- 5. Appropriate discipline techniques include:
  - \* Reinforcement for positive behavior.
  - Modeling appropriate behavior.
  - \* Redirection to a more acceptable behavior.
  - **Setting clear limits, which are stated in a very positive way.**
  - Offer choices.
  - ❖ Ignoring negative behavior while praising positive behavior.
  - ❖ Including the child in resolution of conflict.
- 6. Inappropriate discipline techniques include:
  - ❖ Abuse or neglect.
  - **❖** Isolation.
  - Physical punishment.
  - Cruel, harsh, unusual or extreme techniques.
  - Screaming at the child.
  - \* Ridiculing a child's family or themselves.
  - Confining children to a locked room, enclosed area, or equipment such as cribs or highchairs.
  - ❖ Blaming, teasing, insulting, name calling or threatening the child with punishment.
  - Subject children to inappropriate language or verbal abuse.
  - ❖ Asking children to manage or discipline other children.
  - Using a "timeout" technique.
  - ❖ Withholding of affection or positive attention.
  - Withholding food or beverage.

## WHY:

- o To ensure a degree of safety to children in care away from their families.
- o To teach self-discipline as opposed to motivation by fear of punishment.
- o To ensure that there is a reasonable relationship between inappropriate act and the consequence.
